**Novices 1 Section entry** is open to those not having won a prize in any previous Bridgend County Show Horticultural

1. One single bloom any cultivar.
2. One vase of mixed variety flowers
3. One dish of vegetables, more than one kind
4. One house plant (floral or foliage)

  8. One white rose with own foliage

  20. A spray of a shrub (other than roses bearing Fruit, flowers and or foliage)
  21. One bowl of Pansies, 6 blooms
  22. the most uncommon flower, named if possible
  23. African Violet, one in a pot.
  24. One hanging basket
  25. A Floral pot plant
  26. Two pots of Cacti or succulents pot not to exceed 6 inches in diameter
  27. One zonal or regal pelargonium/ geranium grown in a pot not exceeding 6 inch diameter
  28. One vase of mixed garden flowers
  29. The Top Vase
